

Third juvenile Asbo handed out

A 16-year-old boy from Hersham has become the third Elmbridge juvenile in a month to be handed an antisocial behaviour order (Asbo).

Adam Carter, of Molesey Road, was arrested for being drunk and disorderly in April by Hersham police. He could face a prison sentence if he breaches the Asbo, which bans him from drinking alcohol or entering licensed premises.

Hersham beat officer Mark Bracknell said Carter was one

of a known group of troublemakers in Hersham who had repeatedly come to his attention.

For the next two years Carter, who appeared before North Surrey Youth Court on May 12, will be banned from:

- Entering any licensed premises in Surrey unless with a responsible adult.
- Consuming alcohol or intoxicating substances or liquor in the county.
- Behaving in an antisocial

manner at any time in Coronation recreation ground, Hersham.

● Engaging in behaviour either by himself or with others which could cause harassment, alarm or distress to anyone in Surrey.

PC Bracknell said: "I feel this order will not only serve as a warning to his associates but also improve the area where he lives and behaves in an antisocial manner."

He warned that Asbos could

and would be used against anyone else in the community carrying out antisocial behaviour.

In April 12-year-old Long Ditton schoolboy Scott Forman was placed under an Asbo after terrorising the community.

And earlier this month an Asbo was obtained for a 16-year-old from Elmbridge who committed a string of offences, including robbery and criminal damage. Magistrates would not allow the boy to be identified.

PC Bracknell added: "I will be monitoring youths who have been given an Asbo and would also like to make the public aware that any breaches can be reported to Surrey Police on 0845 125 2222."
