

Mooting Competition - *audience tasks.*

The audience will be given tasks to undertake. Before the Moot begins you will be given one of the three tasks. Throughout the moot, you should be listening to the arguments presented by the moot teams and writing down answers to the below points.

Task 1.

- a. Write down a list of cases and judges referred to in the Moot by both the Appellants and the Respondents.
- b. Which Court were the cases heard in?
- c. Which special study sources did the appellants/respondents refer to?
- d. Give a mark out of 10 for the above to each legal team.

Task 2.

- a. Did both the appellant and respondent counsels explain the ratio of the cases they referred to? Explain which, and how.
- b. Did the appellants or respondents seek to distinguish in their arguments, and if so how?
- c. Which side relate the facts of the moot to the law best? Why/how?
- d. Give a mark out of 10 for the above to each legal team

Task 3.

- a. Did both the appellant and respondents counsels refer to the judgements of individual judges? If so, which judges and what were the arguments?
- b. Did any of the Moot Counsel give scenarios to illustrate a point? If they did, how effective were they?
- c. Were the respondents responding to the arguments of the appellants, or were they simply presenting prepared arguments? Illustrate your answer.
- d. Give a mark out of 10 for presentation of the legal argument.
